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(A). INTRODUCTION

The Sadau Asom Gramya Puthibharal Santha was established on 27th January, 1985 in a public meeting held at the District Library Auditorium, Nagaon, Assam in presence of representatives of village libraries and Social Workers of almost every nock and corner of Assam. This meeting has decided to constitute a non-political, non-communal state level voluntary organization for the greater interest of village libraries as well as all round development of down-trodden people of the society through various social welfare activities. Accordingly, the meeting had constituted an executive committee consisting 32 Nos. of members involving from the entire State of Assam. Sri Putul Ch. Bora, Morigaon as founder President and Sri Balladev Sarmah, Nagaon were elected as founder General Secretary respectively.

The undivided Nagaon Zilla Puthibharal Santha which was established on 6th June, 1982 had taken initiative for forming the Sadau Asom Gramya Puthibharal Santha for extending welfare activities as well as village library movement within the state of Assam. Sri Haren Bora, founder President and Sri Balladev Sarmah, founder General Secretary of Nagaon Zilla Puthibharal Santha leaded this movement. As per the by-laws of the organization the meeting had decided to constitute the organization in four stage viz village library, sub-divisional level, district level and state level.

Now the Santha had passed 36 years successfully rendering voluntary services to the society. It is mentioned that the Santha had celebrated Silver Jubilee Year in the year 2009-10 also.

Accordingly, 21 Nos. of district level committee, 10 Nos. Sub-divisional committee has been constituted since inception. Till this year 955 Nos. of village level library have been recognized by the Santha and 1164 Nos. of life members, 151 Nos. Donor Members, 25 Nos. of Honorable Members, 95 Nos. of Petron Members and 13613 Nos. of Readers & Volunteer Members were enrolled upto this financial year. Further there are a provision of engagement as volunteers for smooth functioning of the activities and already engaged 1750 Nos. of volunteers in entire Assam for the interest of social welfare programme which known as Puthibharal Mitra. FORMATION OF STATE LEVEL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The organization has been formed a state level executive committee in the interval of every three years by the general body meeting in presence of representatives from the various stages organization which mentioned above like village libraries, sub-divisional and district Santha including Life Members, Donor Members, Honorable Members and Petron.

THE MEETING OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The executive committee meeting was held in every quarter of a financial year in which each and every matters of the organization are discussed like expansion and improvement of organizational matter, grant-in-aid regarding central and state govt. schemes and implementing procedure, collection of funds, donations, loan, budget, work planning, formation of sub-committee, construction, engagement and appointment of staff, supply of food grains/stationary/furniture, cultural activities, sports, relief and rehabilitation, training, observation of different days and divas, book grant and distribution, award and felicitations, educational tour, health and environment etc. During this financial year three numbers of executive committee meeting and seven numbers of sub-committee meeting were held and discussed the various matters as mentioned above.

SUB-COMMITTEE FORMATION

For smooth implementation of schemes and others activities of the organization 12 Nos. sub-committees were formed by the first executive committee as per provision of by-laws of the organization. These are 1) Implementation of central and state govt. schemes/Project review, 2) Budget and Planning, 3) Book grant and beneficiaries selection, 4) Construction and renovation, 5) Award and Facilitation, 6) Staff selection and appointment, 7) Review and monitoring, 8) Staff welfare, 9) By-laws amendment, 10) Magazine, 11) Purchase, 12) Cultural and preservation.

During the year of 2020-21 the Santha has able to receive the special Felicitation from District administration Nagaon for commendable welfare activities. It is Felicited by honorable chief Minister of Assam, then Heath & Education Minister Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarmah at flag hosting programme of Republic Day 26th January, 2021 held at Nurul Amin Stadium Nagaon.

Activities of the Santha – 2023-24

Like previous year the following activities conducting by the Santha during the financial year of 2023-24 with the financial assistance of Central and State govt. as well as public donation, subscription and own fund of the Santha which able to complete successfully.

GENERAL(01). FOUNDATION DAY (PUTHIBHARAL WEEK) - The Santha has observed 38th foundation day on 27th January at head quarter of the Santha with a day long programme as inauguration of Puthibharal Week which Santha has been observed this week from 27th January to 2nd February last 16 years. Accordingly, this week are observed indifferent location of state through village library, sub-division and district Santha. On occasion of the week various activities were implemented like public meeting, popular talk, competition, rally, street drama etc. for awareness of people for increase of reading habit as well as need of village library and information about the govt. plan & policy. Besides during the week Santha highlighted the health & environment issues, right to women & child welfare activities, Senior citizen activities, disability issues, prevention of drugs & alcohol, superstition, witch hunting, skill development activities, agriculture-based activities etc. This year the Puthibharal Week was observed centrally at Santha's head office Nagaon. with the collaboration of Nagaon Zila Puthibharal Santha.

During this Puthibharal week various activities were conducted by district and sub-divisional organization of Morigaon, Goalpara, Borpheta, Darrang, Sonitpur, Jorhat, Sivasagar, Lakhimpur, Gohpur, Tinsukia, Biswanath, Golaghat, Dibrugarh, Nalbari and Hojai etc.

GENERAL(02). OBSERVATION OF PUTHIBHARAL DIVAS - Like previous years on 9th August, 2023 the Santha had observed 130th death anniversary of **Dr. Sewali Ramamrita Ranganathan**, father of library science in India and famous activist of Library law enactment movement. This year the Puthibharal Divas was observed at central office of the Santha. The occasion of the day Swachha Bharat Abhiyan, Plantation, various competitions, a public meeting was organized. Besides the said days was observed by the all sub-divisional and district branches of the Santha.

General (03). OBSERVATION OF READERS DAY - Like previous years the Santha had been observed the Readers Day in the memory of **Krishna Kanta Handique**, a prominent scholar and first vice - chancellor of Guwahati University on 20th July at central office of the organization a online a seminar programme with the aegis of Nagaon Zilla Puthibharal Santha. Since 2007 the Santha had been observing the day regularly in entire Assam by the help of the branches of the organization.

General (04). In the occasion of above mentioned divas the Santha has organized awareness meeting, seminar, public meeting, health checkup camp, plantation, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, street drama, rally etc. Besides, various competition organized among the students. The Santha has distributed light food among the participants of the cultural troops in the Republic day and Independence Day for last 20 years. This year also distributed 1500 Nos. of light food among participants in the both programme. On the occasion of Senior Citizen Day, Disabled Day, Girl Child Day, World Day against Child Labour, the Santha had distributed the books, cloths, fruits, medicine etc. among the needy persons.

More over Santha has observed festivals like Saraswati Puja, Biswakarma Puja, Holi, Janmastami, Birth Anniversary of Srimanta Sankar Deva, and Mahapurash Madhab Dev, Bihu, Eid etc. where all inmates of the Senior Citizen Home, Santi Sadan (Swadhar Greh), Children Home are participated including all Staff of the Santha.

General (05). SANTHA'S PUBLICATION - The Santha has published a lot of books and magazines. The publication of the Santha like- 1) Annual magazine "GYAN JYOTI", 2) 'Library & Librarian' (Hand Book for library activist) 3) Life sketch of "Dr. Sewali Rammrita Ranganathan", 4) Directory of village libraries and life members, 5) "RUPALI" (souvenir of silver jubilee), 6) Monthly bulleting "Puthibharal Mitra" which are run by the organization. In this year the Santha has published a regular wall magazine "GYAN JYOTI". Further this year the Santha had distributed various IEC materials among the trainees as well as common people and members of the organization. Also published a hand bill on dowry prohibition Act. Domestic violence act. Right to information act. Girl child, stop child labour etc.

General (06). BOOK DISTRIBUTION AND COLLECTION - The Santha has been conducting a book distribution and collection programme since inception. Under this programme the Santha has collected the books from various organizations, members of the organization, and well-wishers of the organization in the various corner of the state. Accordingly, the Santha has distributed the said books to the village libraries for creating reading habit among the villagers. This year the Santha is able to collect 6565 Nos. of books from well-wishers and distributed to 55 Nos. of village libraries.

General (07). RELIEF & REHABILITATION AND TRAINING ACTIVITIES - The Santha has been conducting a relief and rehabilitation activities since inception among the needy persons those who are badly affected by natural disaster like- flood, erosion, storm, burning etc. Accordingly, this year the Santha has provided 155 Nos. of grocery packets among the flood affected families.

IMPLEMENTATION OF GOVT. PROJECTS/ SCHEMES

Since inception the Santha has been running a lot of govt. projects/schemes for welfare of women and children, senior citizens, education, health, disabilities etc. which are mentioned below -

FAMILY COUNSELLING CENTRE

The Family Counselling Centre is a women related scheme initiated by Central Social Welfare Board, under Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India which is running through non govt. organization. Accordingly, the Santha is able to get opportunity to run the said scheme since 1992. From starting of the scheme total 2558 Nos. cases are registered and 1552 Nos. cases are closed. In the financial year the total 150 Nos. of cases were registered and 54 Nos. cases were closed. The nature of the cases which were dealt by the FCC center are as mentioned below- Marital maladjustment, domestic violence, dowry demand, child marriage, illegal pregnancy, extra-marital relation, Depression, bigamy etc. For smooth functioning of the centre a sub-committee has been constituted consisting 8 Nos. of members under the presidentship of Social Worker cum public prosecutor Smt. Bibha Phukan, Nagaon Bar Association. The members of the committee were regularly present in the meeting and they discussed all the matters related to FCC. During this financial year 6 Nos. of awareness meetings were organized in different locations of the district namely Noh-Pam, Ghanhi, Dhing, Barhampur, Itapara and Huz Gaon. International Women's Day on 8th March was also observed by the FCC at Ghahi Gaon Panchayat Community Hall, Nagaon (Assam) in collaboration with Social Welfare Department, Govt. of Assam, Kalangpar Mohila Vikash Kendra, Nagaon and Barsatra Puthibharal, Ghahi. In the occasion of the day Swaccha Bharat Abhiyan, Sapling plantation, Rally, Street Drama programme also conducted before public meeting. Sri Haren Bora president of Ghanhi Ancholik Sakha Sahitya Sabha, Sri Reba Kt. Das, Retd. Inspector of sericulture cum journalist has formally inaugurated the said programme. The street drama and the rally was formally inaugurated by Smt. Nirala Das, a senior social worker. In connection of the day a special health check-up camp also organized by the Santha with the help of health department, Govt. of Assam. A public meeting was held under the presidentship Sri Haren Bora which was formally inaugurating the meeting. Smt. Kobita Bora president of Ghanhi Gaon Panchayat. Smt. Kobita Bora counsellor of Zila Parishad has attended as a guest of honour. Smt. Kobita Devi Kusre professor of Naoi College has attended as an appointed speaker. Sri Kamal Sarmah, Social Worker attend as a special invitee. 25 Nos. Supervisor, 250 Nos. of AWC Workers and helper of Raha & Khagarijan ICDS project has participated in the programme. Sri Balladev Sarmah, general Secretary of Santha conduct the meeting where Sri Aparajita Nath Bora, Counsellor of FCC explain the aims and objectives of the meeting. The vote of thanks offered by Smt. Daisy Senapati, coordinator of the Santha.

AIDU HANDIQUE SAKTI SADAN (SWADHAR GREH)

The SAKTI SADAN (Swadhar Greh) is a women related scheme sponsored by Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India which is implemented by the Organization under Social Welfare Department, Govt. of Assam. Earlier this scheme is known as Short Stay Home under Central Social Welfare Board sponsored by the said ministry.

Since 2016-17 Short Stay Home is converted to Swadhar Greh with the capacity of 30 Nos. inmates including 7 Nos. children as per guidelines. Accordingly this financial year the organization has provided shelter to 25 nos. of women and 05 Nos. Children. The inmates are allowed to stay maximum period of 3 years those who are identified as destitute and abandoned women, particularly victimised by their husband, family members and others due to dowry, bigamy, domestic violence, extra marital affairs, alcoholism etc. Inmates of the home are referred by Govt. and Non-Govt. sources like Panchayat members, Asha workers, Police department, Social Welfare Department, Family Counselling Centre, Anganwadi Workers, Health Department, and One Stop Centre etc. Some inmates come to home herself after facing tortured by the family. The inmates are admitted between the age group of 15-35 yrs. after proper health check up by the medical officer and counseling by counsellors of the home (Greh). The children below 7 years also are admitted along with their mother. During the staying period of inmates, the Santha had provided vocational training, imparted literacy classes in the home and also by other training institution registered under NCVT etc. The children who come with mother between age group 0-6 years are enrolled in Anganwadi centres and Creche centres and they getting entire facilities from the said centres. Above 6 years children's are enrolled at local primary school.

The Santha constituted a monitoring committee in order to ensure their smooth functioning and suggesting steps for better management in the Greh. The meeting of the committee is held quarterly to review the activities. The necessary facilities as per the scheme is provided to the inmates. There is a menu for their breakfast, lunch, dinner which is displayed in the home. The Santha has organized awareness meeting regularly once in a month and discuss on health and hygiene, self-dependency, behavior, right to women, State and central govt. policy and schemes adopted for welfare of needy women. The inmates also get opportunity for performing all religious festivals Bihu, Durga Puja, Eid, Holi, SankardevaTithi, Sarawasti Puja, Shiva Ratri etc. Besides games and sports cultural activities, yoga programme, educational tour has arranged for their development. Inmates are involved in various divas observed by the Santha like New Year day, Silpi Divas, foundation day of the organization, AIDS day, National Science Day, Environment day, Population Day, Breast feeding week, Quami Ekta Saptah, Literacy Day, Birth Anniversary of Dr. Bhupen Hazarika, Birth Day of Netaji Subhas Ch. Bose, Rabindra Jayanti, Birth Day of Swami Vivekananda, Birthday of Deendayal Upadhyaya, Republic Day, Independence Day, Nutrition month, Children's day etc. Regular health checkup programmes are also conducted by the Santha.

During this financial year the total 07 Nos. of inmates are benefitted including 02 Nos. of children of the Greh. The names of the Greh has been decided by the Santha in memory of Aideu Handique, who was first Assamese actress of the film "JAIMATI".

During this year 2 Nos. of dignitaries has visited the home including District Social Welfare Officer, Nagaon and other officials of the district administration. They also interacted with the inmates and encouraged them. The special medical health check-up camp were organized by District health department, Govt. of Assam.

As per the revised guideline of the Ministry the Sakti Sadan (Swadhar Greh) Santha has engaged 1 No. Superintendent,, 1 No. Clerk cum Typist, 2 Nos. Multi Tasking Staff, 2 Nos. Cook, 3 Nos. Grade IV employees for smooth functioning of the Sadan.

NATIONAL CRECHE SCHEME

The National Creche Scheme is a central govt. scheme implemented by the Ministry of Women and Child Development through the Non Govt. Organization under State Govt. entire the country between age group 0-6 years those who enrolled from BPL families. Accordingly, children are enrolled those whose parents are engaged in domestic assistance, Daily wages in tea garden, Construction work, Private factories and industries etc. before leaving from the home parents are drop their children at Creche Centre for their all-round development as well as healthy life of children. There are 2 nos. staff, namely one Worker and one Helper for taking care of the child and providing nutritious food and conduct pre-school programme, playing, dancing, singing etc.

It is mentioned that the Santha is conducting 38 Nos. of Creche Unit in different locations of Nagaon, Sonitpur and Darrang district. Under Assam State Social Welfare Board as well as Social Welfare Department, Govt. of Assam. In which 25 Nos. children in each Centre are benefitted and total 950 Nos. children are benefitted in every year. These Centre's starts every day from 9.30 am to 3.30 pm and total nos. of 22 working days in a month.

As per budget provision providing nutritious food to the children and bear an amount of rupees 12 per day per child where 10% expenditure borne by the organization against total budget of the scheme.

During this financial year the Santha is running the centres properly and providing necessary facilities to the beneficiaries. Review and monitoring meeting is organized once in a month. The necessary reports has been submitted by the workers and reviewed the same. All the centres have organized the monthly meeting of local committee and discuss their performance, problems, health checkup, nutrition etc. Besides this health check-up programme are conducted regularly and provide medicines where necessary.

Every year the entire centre have observed "Children's day" on 14th November and Mother's Day, Nutrition week, Breast feeding week etc. Workers and Helper of each centre have participated in the immunization programme organized by Health Department, Govt. of Assam. The Worker and Helper regularly contacted with Asha Worker, Anganwadi Worker and local organizations, Panchayat etc. All the centres are established at prominent places of the locality. During this financial year 2 Nos. of orientation training programme are organized for Worker & Helper for better performance of the centers from own resources of the organization.

MAINTENANCE OF SENIOR CITIZENS HOME, NAGAON

The Sadau Asom Gramya Puthibharal Santha Has been running the senior Citizen Home Since 2001 sponsored by Ministry Of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India, As per guideline 25 Nos. of Older Person are admitted in the home every years, those who unable to survive the healthy life with the family as well as helpless persons. Moreover Santha allow to stay in the home specially who unable to stay in their own houses, due to family burden, family dispute, lack of food , maintenance of good health properly and deprivation of the society etc. during this financial year 19 Nos. of Female and 6 Nos. of Male are staying in the home. Among the said inmates 13 Nos. of female have crossed 75 years and 12 Nos. of inmates already crossed 80 years.

During staying in the home all the inmates used to avail all local and regional festivals like Bihu, Durga puja, Shivarati, Saraswati puja, Holi, Independence day and Republic day, International Senior Citizen Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Women Day , World AIDS day etc. Since inception of the home total 6325 Nos. of inmates are benefitted by the home those who came from various parts of the state .The necessary nutritious foods provided to inmates as per menu .The regular health check-up programme are conducted among the inmates. The recreational facilities, excursion, literacy classes, counseling programme, reading materials are organized . Book & Magazine, daily and weekly Newspaper are also provided to the inmates.

MAINTENANCE OF SENIOR CITIZENS HOME, TINSUKIA (OLD AGE HOME)

Santha has running the another Senior Citizen Home from own resources in the year of 2018-19. It is also mention that Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India has accord to the sanction only one home atTinsukia district for 50 Nos. of elderly women in the year of 2020-21. Vide sanction letter No. 15-2(9)/2020-21-Sr.C.I Dated- 15/04/2021. As per sanctioned Santha has running the home smoothly and maintain all terms and conditions. Necessary food, health checkup, recreational facilities provided to inmates of the Home. During staying in the home all the inmates are celebration all local and regional festivals like Bihu, Durga Puja, Shivaratri, Saraswati Puja, Holi, Independence Day and Republic day, International Senior Citizen Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Yoga Day, Women Day, World AIDS day etc.

Since inception of the home total 155 Nos. of elderly women inmates are benefitted by the home those who came from various parts of the district. The necessary nutritious foods provided to inmates as per menu. The regular health check-up programme are conducted among the inmates. The recreational facilities, excursion, literacy classes, counseling programme, reading materials are organized. Book & Magazine, daily and weekly Newspaper are also provided to the inmates.

OPEN SHELTER HOME

The Open Shelter Home is a child care institution (CCI) sponsored by Ministry of Women and Child Development. Govt. of India as per provision of JJ Act and it has been implemented through Non-Government Organization under State Child Protection Society, Assam as well as Department of Social Welfare, Govt. of Assam. Accordingly, the Santha has been conducting the Open Shelter Home at Panjabari, Guwahati in 2009-10 with a capacity of 25 Nos. of Children those whoarerescued by Childline, Police and any other authorized organization, from Railway station, market places and roads etc. and referred by Child Welfare Committee. upto age group of 18 years. Since inception 1165 Nos. of children are providing shelter.

During this financial year the total 213 Nos. of children are admitted in the home. Between the admitted children 184 Nos. of children restored to their families and 2 Nos. of children's are transferred to the other Home. The said children are restored through CHILDLINE and Child Welfare Committee.

During the staying period children are getting food, cloth, health checkup, vocational training for their all-round development, education facilities, games and sports, cultural activities, educational tour etc. As per the scheme there are three nos. of contact point at Satgaon, Beltola and ISBT under Guwahati Municipality Corporation. The Outreach Workers of the contact point are regularly attending the Contact Point and they collect the information and contacted with the child those who run away from home. The CWC, Metro and District Child Protection Unit are monitoring the home regularly for the smooth functioning of home as well as all-round development of the children. The Grievance Redressal Committee and Home Management Committee held regularly as per the guideline of the CCI under the Presidentship of Chairperson, CWC. One Coordinator, One Social Worker, Two Nos. of Care Giver cum Bridge Course Educator, Three Nos. of outReach Worker and One No. of Helper are engaged in the home as per the guideline.

DR. BHIM RAO AMBEDKAR NON RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL

The Non Residential Primary School is an important scheme of Ministry of Tribal Affairs Govt. of India, which is implemented through the Non Govt. Organization in all over India at the tribal people dominated rural and urban area. Accordingly, the Santha has able to establish a primary level school with a capacity of 100 Nos. beneficiaries through state government, Department of Welfare of Backward Classes in the year of 2002-03 at Borkula Adrasa Lalung Gaon in the district of Nagaon, Assam far from about 15 kms. From Nagaon district head quarter as well as central office of the organization. Since inception of the school every year 100 Nos. of students are benefitted those who are belonging from below poverty line of tribal family. The total 670 numbers of children are benefitted by the school since inception to till date. During this financial year 95 Nos. of student are benefitted by the school. As per the provision of the scheme necessary books and educational equipment, uniform, school bags, shoes and socks, umbrellas etc. are provided to the children every year. The mid-day meal are also provided to the children regularly and maintain a menu and served boil Rice and Dal, Mix rice and green Sabjee, Egg, Meat and Fish, Milk and Biscuit etc. An educational tour is conducted once in a year where students can gather knowledge from educational tour. During this financial year organized annual sports, observed school establishment day, world environment day, Saraswati Puja, Birth anniversary of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar etc. Like previous year this year also annual examination are conducted as per state govt. norms.

WORKING WOMEN HOSTEL

The Santha has been conducting a Working Women Hostel since 2005-06 with a capacity of 60 Nos. of boarders. This hostel was constructed by the Santha with 75% financial assistance from Govt. of India, Ministry of Women and Child Development. Since inception of the hostel 656 Nos. of boarders are staying in the hostel till 2023-24. During the year of 2023-24 newly 45 Nos. of boarders are enrolled in the hostel. Maximum boarders are stayed in the hostel for short term period for skill development training, temporarily engaged in private institutions and non govt. organizations as well as domestic workers. Govt. school teachers and health workers are also staying in the hostel. The nominal fees collected from the boarders for water and electricity and maintenance of the hostel. The Santha has organized awareness meeting and discussed rules and regulations of the hostels in time to time among the boarders, specially health and hygiene, discipline and maintenance of hostel and behavior of the boarders. The organization has not received any financial assistance from state or central govt. and any other sources.

CHILDLINE SUB-CENTRE

The CHILDLINE 1098 services is a national service programme introduced by Govt. of India, Ministry of Women and Child Development which is implemented across the country through CHILDLINE India Foundation and it is running by the non govt. organization. The aims and objectives of services are to reduce and prevent child trafficking, child marriage, child labour, child safety and neglected, abandoned and runaway children as per provision of JJ Act. Accordingly the Santha has able to establish the CHILDLINE Sub-centre at Lanka, Dist- Hojai (Assam) in the year 2012 under CHILDLINE India Foundation. Since inception total 321 Nos. of child related cases are dealing by the centre and able to restore the said children with the support of DLSA, DCPU, CWC, Police etc.

It is matter of pride that Childline sub centre is able to prevent Child Marriage cases in Hojai district which is increasing day by day among the uneducated families. As example 45 Nos. of Child Marriage cases are found. In every year CHILDLINE SE DOSTI, a week long programme is observed on the occasion of Children's day. It is organized in various locations to popularize the CHILDLINE services as well as child rights. On the occasion of the week the Santha has conducted street drama, public meeting and rally, cultural programme, Art & Poster competition, games & sports competitions etc. The part of the awareness programme Santha has distributed the IEC materials and display the hording and signboard etc. The office staff and team member of the sub centre participated in the meetings organized by centre in time to time and explain about the CHILDLINE services. The Director of CHILDLINE Sub centre, Coordinator and Team Members attended the Childline Advisory Board (CAB) meeting and sharing their experiences held at district head quarter under Presidentship of Hon'ble Deputy Commissioner cum Chairman of CAB. The Directors meeting were held regularly and attended the same.

CHILDLINE -1098 (COLLAB)

The CHILDLINE-1098 services are a National services programme introduced by Govt. of India. Ministry of Women & Child Development which is implemented across the country through CHILDLINE INDIA FOUNDATION and it is operated by Non-Govt. organization. CHILDLINE work for the protection of rights of all children aged from 0 to 18. It is an initiative for rescuing and assisting children in distress. This special focus is on all children in need of care and protection. Especially the more vulnerable section i.e. victims of child sexual abuse, street children & youth living alone on the streets, child labour working in the unorganized and organized section, children who need emotional support and guidance, victims of child trafficking, child marriage, Children whose families are in crisis, differently abled, missing children etc. As per provision of Juvenile Justice (Care & protection) Act-2015, as a non-govt. organization the Sadou Asom Gramya Puthibharal Santha has been able to establish the CHILDLINE Collaborative organization at Hojai district, in 2020 sponsored by CHILDLINE India foundation, Mumbai. CHILDLINE, Collabs running properly from the beginning in guidance of Santha from September, 2020. Since inception the CHILDLINE Collab centre total 368 Nos. of cases are registered and take necessary intervention and action with the help of district administration, District child protection unit, District child protection officer, District legal service authority, Child welfare committee and regularly submitted the report of the respective and concerned authority. The nature of cases is registered like child marriage, child labour, medical assistance, restoration, physical abuse, trafficking, needy parents, runaway etc. Awareness campaign/meeting is regularly organized the programme in different location and place i.e. block, panchayat, schools and villages with the support of govt. and non-govt. organization. Besides, in every year CHILDLINE SE DOSTI week long programme on the occasion of 14th November i.e. children day, many programme organized various spot and site and promote the CHILDLINE services as well as child rights and protection. Previous day santha was organized street drama, Public meeting, rally etc. But due to pandemic then programme are not organized. On that day secretary of District legal service authority, Hojai was inaugurated the official vehicle (Van) which was provided by Santha for CHILDLINE services.

SPECIALIZED ADOPTION AGENCY

The Santha has been running the Specialized Adoption Agency sponsored by State Child Protection Society, Assam as well as Department of Social Welfare, Govt. of Assam since 2016-17 at Sankar Nagar, Haiborgaon, Nagaon with the capacity of 10 Nos. of children. This scheme is initiated by Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India. The Santha has been able to get sanction under JJ Act. 2015 (care and protection) from respective department.

Since inception of this scheme the total 25 Nos. of children have been handed over to the PAPs (Prospective Adoptive Parents) by the Santha after fulfillment of all terms and conditions through honorable court. 2 Nos. children were handed over to PAPs of foreign country like Italy and Finland out of 23 Nos. of children during the year of 2022-23 and rest of 4 Nos. children were handed over to PAPs in different states like Assam, Tripura, West Bengal, and Uttar Pradesh. All the children were handed over to the PAPs in presence of Adoption Committee.

Since inception, 108 Nos. of PAPs have been registered with the SAA and this financial year 24 Nos. of PAPs are registered. During this year 4 Nos. of children have been handed over to the PAPs in the state of West Bengal and Assam.

NABAJIBAN SPECIAL NEED CHILDREN HOME

The Child Care Institution (CCI) is an important service for all round development of deprived, neglected and abandoned child introduced by Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India which runs through non-govt. organization under state govt. accordingly there is a provision for special need children under the PWD Act, 1995 and JJ Act-2015. This scheme implemented through non-govt. organization by Assam State Child Protection Society since 2016-17. The Santha has received the formal sanction to run the special need home from above mentioned year with a capacity of 25 Nos. of children. Since inception of the home total 78 Nos. (Boy- 60 Nos. and Girl – 18 Nos.) children are admitted in the home referred by Child Welfare Committee (CWC). In this financial year total 13 Nos. of children enrolled in the Home. As per guidelines the necessary staff are engaged for smooth functioning of the home. As per provision of the scheme we provide necessary nutritious food as per menu prepared by the organization, also provide health & hygienic items, cloths & materials, recreational & entertainment tools and also organized some entertainment programme. Besides these regular health check-up, physiotherapy programme, games and sports, art and culture, literacy classes, life skill training is also conducted.

Moreover sightseeing and outdoor programme is also organized. The CCI observed the different days and divas and festivals like Bihu, Holi, Children's Day, Child Protection Day, Swaccha Pakhwada, Birth Anniversary of Dr. Bhupen Hazarika, Bishnu Rabha Divas, Swaraswati Puja, Silpi Divas, Yoga Day, World Disabled Day, Gandhi Jayanti, World Girl Child Day, AIDS Day, Independence Day, Republic Day, World Hand Wash Day etc. Moreover community feast programme has been organized on the occasion of Magh and Rangali Bihu and outing programme also organized like picnic.

JIVADHARA PROGRAMME (IMPARTING YOGA TO SPECIALLY ABLED CHILDREN)

During this year the Santha has conducted 2 Nos. Jivadhara Programme under NATIONAL AYUSH MISSION, ASSAM. The Centre specially established in Nagaon and Sonitpur district. There should be 25 Nos. children Admitted in the centre and conduct the two sessions of the yoga training to the specially abled children along related activities in a day. The training centre has to be said according to the need of the children for general wellness and integrating the yoga as a complement to other therapies like Physiotherapy, Speech Therapy and occupational therapy etc. The Santha has organized Ayush consultancy service and free medical and health check up camp monthly in the centre. During this year 50 Nos. abled children are benefited in the programme.

ESTABLISHMENT OF PRIMARY & MIDDLE LEVEL, HIGH SCHOOL

For the welfare of the poor students of the neighbouring areas of the organization like- Englishpatty, Bishnu Nagar, Sankar Nagar etc. the Santha has opened a primary level school in the memory of Veteran Educationist Late Horeswar Goswami in the year of 1996 from its own resources of the organization. Since inception of the school in every year 60 to 70 nos. poor students are able to get free primary education. Secondly the Santha has established a high school in memory of Netaji Subash Ch. Bose during the year of 2006. Since inception of this school 120 Nos. of poor students are able to get free education and provide mid-day meal. Both the schools are situated at roadside of Chanmari Road (Lal Chand Todi PWD road), Sankar Nagar campus of the central office. The necessary teaching and management staff are engaged for smooth functioning. During this financial year 95 Nos. of poor students are able to get education from this institution with the initiative of Santha. The school building is well ventilated and water supply, electricity is available. The school building is constructed from own resources. As per state govt. norms various activities/divas are observed for physical & mental development of the student like- School foundation day, Games & Sports, Cultural Programme, World Environment Day, National Science Day, Teachers Day, Rabha Dibas, Jyoti Dibas, Independence Day, Republic Day etc. besides Annual Educational Tour, sightseeing, Science exhibition are also organized. On the occasion of the divas various competitions are organized among the students.

SCHOOL FOR SPECIAL NEED CHILDREN

The Santha has established a non residential special school from own resources known as "Nayantora" for specially abled children. Total Nos. 255 children between age group 6-14 has been benefitted since inception those who identify as Autism, Cerebral palsy, Mental retardation, Multiple disabilities and visually impaired. During this year 45 Nos. of children admitted in the school and provided education, therapist, health check up also provided nutritious food during the school hours. The necessary teaching and others staffs are engaged for smooth functioning. In initiative of the Santha the all children enroll in school able to received scholarship from Department of Social Welfare, Govt. of Assam.

DRUGS DE ADDICTION COUNSELLING PROGRAMME

Since inception the Santha has been conducting several welfare programme from own resources for all round development for needy persons of the society in different locations of the state. Apart from this programme the Drug De- Addiction cum Counselling Programme is an important activity of the Santha. The Santha regularly conducted and implemented various activities like awareness and counselling programme among youth and adult for avoiding habit of using drugs, alcohol etc. Since inception of this activities approximate 9320 Nos. peoples are benefitted by the programme. Besides 15 nos. of Drug De-Addiction Counselling Centre are running by the Santha for last three years at Jorhat, Golaghat, Kamrup, Borpheta, Charaidew, Tinsukia, Bongaigaon, Karbi Anglong, Baska and Nagaon from own resources and also submitted the project proposals to the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India for sanctioning the same. But not able to receive the sanction from the concerned ministry. During this financial year above mentioned centres are running smoothly and benefitted 3570 Nos. people.

STRENGTHENING STAFF POSITION

The Santha has a Central office Staff for implementing and supervising the projects namely Project Officer, Asst. Project Officer, Office Superintendent, Project Coordinator, Accountant, Asst. Accountant, Cashier, Field Officer, Campus Care taker, Store Keeper, Computer Operator, Clerk-cum Typist, Grade IV etc. Besides these the Santha has appointed necessary Staff against the Project as per sanction of the schemes. Accordingly total 186 Nos. of Employees are engaged in different schemes including part time and full time staff. It is mentioned that the Santha has organized skill development workshop in time to time among the staff for their encouragement and improvement of their activities. The Santha has organized monthly review and monitoring meeting for their better performance. Different sub-committee meetings are also held quarterly for monitoring of performance. Some staff members are also attend the training programme organized by NIPCCD Guwahati and NIPCCD Delhi and district administration, Social Welfare Department, Health department, SCPS, UNICEF, NEN etc. in different times and dates issues related with women and child development, health, education etc. All the staff are submitted their monthly activities report which discussed in the monthly meeting.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

In the year of 2012-13 the Santha has introduced free internship programme for College and University students. Accordingly since inception of the programme 86 Nos. of students joined the programme in different times those who are studying in Nowgong College, Nagoan Girls College, Handique Girls College, Guwahati University, NERIM Groups of Institutions, Guwahati, AMITY university, Delhi University, Dibrugarh University, IGNOU, Biswa Bharati Shanti Niketan, Mahapurush Sreemanta Sankar Dev University, Kaziranga University, University of Science and Technology, Meghalaya, Christ University, Bangalore, Assam Engineering College, Guwahati, Jorhat and Miranda House, Delhi University and they successfully completed their course. After ending the field visit programme the office bearers interacted with the students and those who able to show efficiency, the organization issue a certificate to the students. During the year 2023-24 total 36 Nos. of students have enrolled this programme. For conducting this programme 6 Nos. of expert in respective subjects are engaged.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

For the interest of rehabilitation of un-employed youth the Santha has been conducting a skill development programme since 2010-11 from its own resources in 7 Nos. of trade namely Computer, Cutting & Tailoring, Beautician, Health care, Jute craft, Cane & bamboo, handloom, where 1185 Nos. unemployed youth are able to get training in above mentioned trade. During this year 450 Nos. of unemployed youth are benefited by this programme and there are 70% trained youth are getting jobs in various private establishment training institute. Besides Santha has organized a short time training programme and awareness camp on self-employment, agriculture, formation of self-help group among economically backward women widow, un-married girl and destitute women. During this financial year 150 Nos. of above mentioned category women are benefited. This financial year Santha has opened Skill Development Centres at Ghanhi, Nagaon (Assam),

WELFARE ACTIVITIES ON SC/ST AND MINORITY

To fight for poverty reduction, economic growth and strengthening of civil society the status of minority people in the country particularly those who are from the disadvantaged sections should be elevated for favourable empowerment is very essential. So, organization has established about 160 Nos. of Child Labour School in the minority dominated area to eliminate illiteracy. The organization is rendering assistance to the minority community through Family Counselling Centre, Old Age Home and Short Stay Home. The Santha has given stress on empowerment of minority women and emboldening them. Besides these Santha is provide vocational training to the minority girls, women and students where 4565 Nos. beneficiaries are benefitted.

WORKER'S WELFARE FUND

In view of welfare of the employees of the Organization, in the year of 1995 Santha has formed a Workers Welfare Fund among the general and project staff. In this regards an amount of rupees 100/- directly deposited to bank account from each staff in every month from their monthly salary. An amount of rupees 100/- are also deposited by the organization in every month for every employees as monthly bonus which start 2020-21 as future welfare programme of the staff. Accordingly all staff of the organization deposited an equal amount in future welfare fund which will be released at the time of retirement with interest as decided by management committee. for any emergency causes like Medical and Marriage etc. employees are allow to take loan from the said fund with the interest of 3% after fulfill all the procedure. Total an amount of rupees 13,46,692.00 are available at the said fund.

SEWALI RAMAMRITA RANGANATHAN SMRITI PUTHIBHARAL

Since 1996-97 the Santha has been running a library at Central office from its own resources in the memory of Father of Library Science Dr. Sewali Ramamrita Ranganathan. Average 69% readers are attending the Library every day. Necessary books, monthly & weekly magazines and newspapers are provided to readers. Total 24,846 Nos. reader members are enrolled till date. A public library building was constructed by the organization with the help of 75% financial assistance under Raja Rammohan Roy Library foundation, Kolkata under the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, New Delhi. At present the library is running smoothly. The Santha has formally requested to Director of Library Services, Govt. of Assam for providing financial assistance. Librarian and assistant are engaged for smooth functioning of the libraries.

CHILDREN LIBRARY

The Santha has set up a Children Library in the year 2001-02 in the office campus of the organization. Since inception about 8823 Nos. Children were benefitted. It is mentioned that the Santha has decided to construct one permanent building in the memory of renowned Social Worker, freedom fighter and advocate Late Abu Sama. Moreover, the Santha has proposed to establish a children library in each districts head quarter of the state. Presently children library is maintained properly. The Santha has proposed to submit the proposal to govt. of Assam for allotment of land for construction of children library and also decided submit the proposal for financial assistance an amount of rupees 50 Lakhs for each library.

HEALTH CHECKUP & AWARENESS PROGRAMME

The Santha is always trying to fulfill the aims of “good health to all”. Accordingly, the Santha is providing health education to rural people especially to mothers under RCH. Besides, the Santha has organized various Health Awareness Programme such as Pulse Polio immunization, AIDS, Malaria, Leprosy, Hepatitis B, Cancer, T.B. etc. Besides this health checkup camp also organized in time to time on occasion of foundation day of the organization, International Senior Citizen Day, International Womens Day, Childrens Day, Gandhi Jayanti etc. with the help of health department, Govt. of Assam, Nagaon, Sreemanta Sankar Mission Mobile dispensary and Kolongpar Mohila Bikash Kendra. Since inception of the organization about 85 Nos. of health checkup camp and 275 Nos. of Awareness camp are organized in different location of the state specially Nagaon & Morigaon where 16,855 Nos. people are benefitted. During this financial year 12 Nos. of healthcheckup camp and 18 Nos. of Awareness camp are organized where 3823 Nos. of people are benefitted.

OBSERVATION OF INTERNATIONAL DAY OF YOGA AND TRAINING CENTRE

As like previous years Santha has conducted Yoga Training Centre where 3150 Nos. of trainees like - Students, Youth, Anganwadi Workers, and Teachers were benefitted. During 2003-04 the Santha had set up a Yoga Training Centre in the office campus of the Organization and conducted training programme for School teacher deputed by State Govt.sponsored by - Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India for 100 Nos. of teacher only. Since establishment the Santha had been running this centre from its own sources where about 5870 Nos. beneficiaries were benefitted. Moreover, the Santha has observed the “International Yoga Day” on 21st June since 2015 in every year after declared by Honorable Prime Minister, Govt. of India where 2955 Nos. participants are benefitted. During this year observed the same where 175 Nos. of participants are benefitted.

BOOKS GRANT AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO THE STUDENTS

The Santha has introduced a Book grant and financial assistance programme for economically backward student as well as BPL families during the year of 2001-02 which are merit but not capable of continue their education. In view of that, Santha has provided the Books and financial aid to the students as mentioned above category. Since starting the said programme 595 Nos. of students are benefited by this programme. During this year 86 Nos. of Students are benefitted by this programme.

PRESENTATION OF TITLE & AWARDS

In the year of 2000-01 the Santha has introduced a facilitation programme by giving title & Award for veteran literary & Cultural activist, Rural Library and Library movement activist, Social activist, and prominent educationist. TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR DISABLED PERSON

An important part of the Santha for person with disabilities is Welfare activities which conducted by the Santha since its inception through various welfare programme. In this regards Santha has conducted Vocational Training, Games & Sports, and various competition on occasion of World Disable Day and also conduct awareness meeting and health checkup programme. Moreover, Santha set up a training centre for providing short term training on computer, cane & bamboo, chalk making, cutting & knitting and Jute Craft for their self-rehabilitation from own resource of the Santha. 1015 Nos. variouscategory of disabled persons between age group 18 to 55 were benefited since inception of the programme. During this financial year 155 Nos. of disabled persons are benefited by above mentioned training programme.

AGRICULTURE BASE ACTIVITIES

The Santha has established an agriculture based farm measuring of 3 bighas of land where produce verities seasonable vegetables item and Santha has a pond for fishing. Santha has also cultivated for production of grain at villagearea through 10 Nos. farmer on contractual based of 50 Bighas land. Against this activities about 50 Nos. of rural labours are engaged. Annually apprx. an amount of rupees 2.7 lakhs are earned. 56 Nos. of goat firming and 82 Nos. of duck unites also conduct in rural area through 158 Nos. farmer.

GAMES & SPORTS

The Santha has been conducting various games & sports competition programmes in different places through its branch organizations since inception. During the year 2020-21 the Santha has organized Football, Carrom, Kabaddi competition etc. amongst the school students where about 6867 Nos. students were participated. All the programmes conducted by Santha's own resources for the interest of youth development on the occasion of different days and divas observed by the organization.

Planning & Budget

In the beginning of the every financial year executive committee of the Santha approve a budget submitted by sub-committee of planning & budget committee after discussed the details in the executive meeting. There is a provision of budget general expenditure, covering administrative expenditure, rural library improvement, training, seminar, workshop, health, environment & education, agriculture, industries, festival, relief & rehabilitation etc. secondly, there is a provision of the budget for various schemes run by the organization with the help of various Ministry of Central Govt. and various department of State Govt. Accordingly, the committee has approved the rupees 5 Crores budget for the year of 2023-24.

SOURCES OF FUND

Since inception, the Santha has raised its fund from membership fee, subscriptions, and donations etc. Besides the Santha has organized the cultural programmes, theatre, gift coupon etc. for raising fund. The Santha also able to raise the fund from cultivation, Fishing, House rent, Vocational & Skill development training etc. The grant-in-aid is the main source of the Santha for running the various schemes run by the Santha under various Ministry, Department, State and Central Govt. like Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Women and Child Development, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt. of India, Department of Social Welfare, Govt. of Assam, State Child Protection Society, Assam, Nagaon District Child Labour Project Society, Untied fund received from Deputy commissioner through the local MLA etc.

Funds are transacted through the bank by DBT, RTGS, CHEQUE, PFMS, with the Joint signature of president and General Secretary of the organization. The Santha has 19 Nos. of Bank A/C in different local & Nationalized Bank namely State Bank of India, United Bank of India, Canara Bank, HDFC Bank, Pragjyotish Bank, Assam Gramin Vikash Bank, Bandhan Bank etc.

Assets and Property of the Santha

The organization has 4 nos. multi storied building and four Assam type building at central office campus with approximate 18500 sqft. Space. Besides two nos. of Assam type school building, one number of Sahitya Sabha Bhawan which is approximately 3268 sq.ft. are also completed. The organization has 15 bigha land and present value of the land approximate 1 crore 50 lacks. Entire land is utilized for the construction of building, Farming, Fishing, education and cultivation.

In the main building of the organization there are one guest room, 6 Nos. of staff room and a garage for vehicle. Water and sanitary facilities including toilet and bath room are available in the building. Two nos. of vehicle, one is Bolero and one tracker is in running condition. Office furniture like - steel and wooden almirah, rack, book self, locker, full and half secretariat table, computer, laptop, inverter, generator, refrigerator, CCTV, wall clock, T.V sound set, games and sports items, digital camera, android mobile, land line, LCDP projector, motor cycle, hand carrier aqua guard, iron, washing machine etc. are available. Approximate value of the all movable & Immovable assets is about Rs. 9 crore 50 lacks.
